





Connections

Waukegan's Food Desert

- USDA Food Desert A minimum of 20 minutes commute one way for access to healthy food options
- Waukegan & North Chicago both have areas that qualify as food deserts, including downtown Waukegan
- WaukGrow aimed to present food forests as an option to mitigate the impact of local food deserts







Workshops – The Warm-up

- Taught the basics of food forests, how to select sites for them, and their benefits
- Reached out to local schools, gardens, food growers of all capacities, etc.
- As each workshop was hosted, interest grew, as did the number of attendees

- Emphasis on native foods and local cuisines help encourage ownership of new food forests
- Native species provide ample opportunity for people to better connect with and appreciate native forests and local tribes and their cuisine

- Increasing interest through the workshops led to interest in planting food forests directly
- Connections began with workshop attendees, then spread from one planting partner to another
- 8 partners from the first 2 years alone and more have shown interest for the future as well





A Forest to Flourish

- Food Forest design not only included plant variety, vertical layering, and species mixing to ensure companion planting support, but was customized to address additional partner needs
- Educational opportunities, production purpose, landscaping concerns, aesthetic goals, and more were kept in mind
- Students were the primary force behind several plantings and were excited to know that what they planted would someday bear fruit


