Program Structure

- Recruit, hire, and train 12-16 interns annually
- Priority given to young people coming from disfavored communities with lower tree canopy
- Interns are paid part-time/temp employees with CoA and receive specialized training & education throughout year










2024-25 Participant Demographics



How to Achieve Deliverables







Tips and Advice

- Over-recruit/Over-hire
- Compensation
- Workforce development trainings
- Focus on relationships
 - People OVER Projects
- Flexibility (up to a point)
- Over-communicate
 - Text is best
- Multiple reminders (Time management is hard)
- Project-in-a-Box
- Hold staff accountable
- Don't be afraid to let employees go! Do it early
 - "I don't think this is a good fit"
 - "Our expectation is X, this is a non-negotiable"
 - "I'm wondering if X opportunity would work better with your schedule"


