


"Some have estimated the forest cover was as much as 95 percent" (Ohio Department of Natural Resources, 2024)




History of Cleveland's urban forest

- Founded in 1796 by Moses Cleaveland
- Central hub of industry, commerce and trade
- Nicknamed The Forest City in late 1800s and early 1900s
- 220,000 street trees in the 1940s to 120,000 street trees today" (Cleveland Tree Plan, 2015)
